 - ♦ Review of draft relating to mandated fifth response to FOIA requests.—"The requested records do not exist or cannot be found after diligent search."

 Background: During 2005, the Council has been working on a legislative draft mandating a fifth response to a FOIA request—the requested records do not exist or cannot be found after diligent search. Currently under FOIA, a public body is under no obligation to create records that do not exist in response to a specific request nor is a public body required to respond to a requester if the requested record does not exist. The lack of a required response in these instances leads to confusion and exacerbates any feelings of distrust. The Council, in a written opinion (AO-16-04) has previously opined that a public body should make this written response where applicable in order to avoid confusion and frustration on the part of the requester.
 - ♦ Review of draft recommended by the PPEA/PPTA Subcommittee. The PPEA/PPTA Subcommittee, consisting of Council members Axselle, Edwards, Wiley, and Houck, will make its recommendation for amendments to FOIA and the PPEA/PPTA to ensure public access to the procurement records of PPEA/PPTA projects without adversely affecting the competitive process.
