FOIA Council,

Thank you for your service on the FOIA Council. I hope you agree that it is important to make public service (whether elected or appointed) more accessible for all Virginians, so that we may achieve more representative, effective public policy. As a member of the public, I benefit from a government that reflects my community and includes a diversity of voices and experiences.

After all the months we have lived through the CoVid-19 pandemic, it is abundantly clear that the DIGITAL AGE IS NOW!! It is more than past time for Virginia to move out of the Neanderthal age and get with today's technology. Our leaders are simply showing their age and lack of knowledge of how technology can and should be used.

I support removing the Commonwealth-imposed limit on individual electronic participation by members of a public body.
