Subject: Support of Electronic Meeting Changes

FOIA Council,

Thank you for your service on the FOIA Council. I hope you agree that it is important to make public service (whether elected or appointed) more accessible for all Virginians, so that we may achieve more representative, effective public policy. As a member of the public, I benefit from a government that reflects my community and includes a diversity of voices and experiences.

I support removing the Commonwealth-imposed limit on individual electronic participation by members of a public body. If you choose to recommend a more modest change this year, such as the Subcommittee's recommendation, I urge you to remove the word "serious" in reference to a family member's medical condition that qualifies for an allowable reason for electronic participation. The definition of "serious" is unclear. I believe that members of public bodies should be able to care for family members when needed.

It is also imperative that you codify the authority of public bodies to address any subject during emergency electronic meetings. I need my government to be able to work for me during an emergency.
