Any public body, or any joint meetings thereof, may meet by electronic 105 communication means without a quorum of the public body physically assembled at 106 one location when the Governor has declared a state of emergency in accordance 107 with § 44-146.17 or the locality in which the public body is located has declared a 108 local state of emergency pursuant to \S 44-146.21, provided that (i) the catastrophic 109 nature of the declared emergency makes it impracticable or unsafe to assemble a 110 quorum in a single location and (ii) the purpose of the meeting is to provide for the 111 continuity of operations of the public body or the discharge of its lawful purposes, 112 duties, and responsibilities. The public body convening a meeting in accordance 113 with this subdivision shall:

115 1. Give public notice using the best available method given the nature of theemergency, which notice shall be given contemporaneously with the notice

117 provided to members of the public body conducting the meeting;

2. Make arrangements for public access to such meeting through electronic
communication means, including videoconferencing if already used by the public
