I chair the Alexandria Beautification Commission and during COVID I have seen my commission be more engaged, with a higher attendance rate, than we've had in years past. I have more confidence in FOIA compliance because of the Zoom recording and I know there are fewer barriers to entry for people who might have been unable to participate in the past.

I'm a new parent and I don't know how I would have been able to continue to participate in the commission if we lose the virtual component. People with caretaking responsibilities, work requirements, and so on will continue to be underrepresented in our boards and commissions and that's the last thing any of us want.
