- Does not consider financial considerations to localities and the Commonwealth for the amount of documents produced within a 2-hour period. A single request (out of 4 in a 30-day period) could only take 15 minutes but be hundreds of pages.
- The Commonwealth's FIS is stated to "potentially create an indeterminate impact to state agencies and other public bodies covered by the Virginia Freedom of Information Act."
