FOIA Council,

I am an appointed member of a Fairfax County School Board advisory committee. I feel it is important that you codify the authority of public bodies to address any subject during emergency electronic meetings.

I also encourage you to remove the state limit on individual electronic participation by members of a public body. The law is outdated and needs to change. It has been extremely helpful to work virtually in the last 8 months, as my FT job has continued virtually and I am asleep sharing parenting duties for a K and 2nd grader. If you choose to recommend a more modest change this year, such as the Subcommittee's recommendation, I ask you to remove the word "serious" in reference to a family member's medical condition that qualifies for an allowable reason for electronic participation. I believe that members of public bodies should be able to care for family members when needed.

I hope you agree that we all benefit from a government that better reflects our community and includes a diversity of voices and experiences, including those who have children, aging parents, or jobs that require travel. The inclusion of such members leads to better public policy for all.
